Re: Guidelines for number of police officers to patrol Wallace

Township

## Gentlemen,

At the last Township meeting, a majority of the discussion was focused on what would be the appropriate staffing level of the new police department. Opinions ranged from establishing a 24 hour police department with nine or ten officers to a part time department with three or four officers and every other possible option in between. Emotions were running high and I personally believe emotions need to be kept in check and important decisions, like this one, need to be made based on factual information.

When I began forming the West Vincent Township Police Department, I contacted The International Association of Chiefs of Police Association and the Pennsylvania Governor's Center for Local Government Services for guidance on determining the number of police officers needed to provide adequate protection for the municipality. Both organizations supplied information regarding the startup of a police agency and provided a formula for calculating the suggested number of police officers needed, based on population and call volume. I reached out to both organizations again and utilized their guidance in making my recommendations regarding staffing for the Wallace Township Police Department.

My first step was to obtain the most current population data available for Wallace Township. According to the most recent census, the population of the Township is approximately 3200.

I next researched the number of calls for police services in Wallace Township, for the year 2007. The Brandywine Regional Police Chief provided a written summary of police calls in Wallace Township for the year, which totaled 1840 calls. The report had the calls in Wallace broken down by; total calls for service, traffic citations, traffic warnings, criminal arrests and summary arrests. I have attached a copy of the chief's report for your information.

I next contacted the Chester County Department of Emergency Services (DES), which operates the 911 center in West Chester. Most police departments in Chester County use the services of DES to receive their calls for service by phone and to dispatch their police departments. BRPD is among the many departments that use the services provided by the DES 911 center. The 911 center operates a Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) which keeps track of police calls received and dispatched and assigns a computer generated incident number to each call for service. The CAD also assigns an incident number for each occurrence of officer initiated activity (such as traffic stop, pedestrian stop, DUI stop, arrest, etc.) when a police officer calls it in to the 911 center via phone, MDC transmission, or via radio. DES provided me with a complete break down of the calls for service they have on file for the BRPD, which occurred in Wallace Township during 2007. I was also able to obtain a breakdown of the types of calls as well as the dates and times of the calls. DES has a record of 1050 police calls in Wallace Township for the year. For the purpose of this report I have used the information provided by DES, since it is verifiable via the records generated by DES.

In 2007, 1050 calls for all police services in Wallace Township, including officer initiated activities such as traffic stops, pedestrian stops and suspicious conditions, averaged out to less then 3 calls per day. The number one type of call for police service was "phone assignment", there were 132. DES records for 2007 reflect a very low call for service rate and very low crime rate for Wallace Township as compared to many other municipalities in Chester County. Most calls occurred between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 9:00P.M. During a few months in 2007 there were no calls for service between the hours of 2:00 A.M. and 5:00 A.M. For your information, I have attached a copy of the calls for police services in Wallace Township data that was provided to me by DES.

The International Association of Chief's of Police provides a formula for determining patrol force manpower needs based on the actual or estimated complaint or incident experience in the community. The IACP formula is also utilized by the Pa Governor's Center and when considered with other methods, has been very reliable and relevant. The formula takes several factors into consideration including the duration of calls, officer time off, hours of patrol, volume of calls and population. Incidents that are handled over the phone, internal police matters and traffic stops are removed from the formula. Administrative tasks and positions are not factored in. Following the guidelines set forth by the IACP and using the Township information stated previously, here is the formula and result:

Based on the IACP and Pennsylvania Governor's Center formula, the recommended number of police officers to provide adequate coverage in Wallace Township, is one full time officer and a police chief.

As I stated in my opening remarks, the decision on staffing the police department should be made based on facts and not emotions. It is in my opinion, not necessary to create a police department with 6 full time officers and 4 part time officers; the need for that amount of manpower is unwarranted. The Board of Supervisors may want to consider a smaller department to start providing part time coverage; this will allow your Chief to decide when it is appropriate to expand and save the municipality money over the next few years. Money saved could be used to cover the cost of additional police officers and/or a new police station in the future.

In closing, I hope the information I have provided will assist the Board in the decision making processes.




